# 1 Exercise 1

Look at the following code.

Recreate the following single page document in L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X. The document partially describes itself. If you are done early, you can try to implement the ‘Future Updates’ suggestions at the bottom.

# LaTeX sample file

## 1 Introduction

This is just an arbitrary article to explore L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X (this fancy LaTeX can be made using ‘\LaTeX’). By the way, the backslashes are made using \textbackslash.

This is a new line within the same paragraph made with \\. Using this is considered bad practice.

This is a new paragraph. You can see the difference clearly; all the paragraphs except the first one have an indent. A paragraph can be created by using white-space (a ‘double enter’) in the .tex file, or by using the \par command.

Now I used a \bigbreak, in order to create a whitespace. This can improve readability. The \bigbreak command also creates a natural place for the compiler to end the page and continue on a new page.

### 1.1 Historical remarks

There are no historical remarks, for this is a very recently made article. Note how you need to compile twice before the table of contents has updated to include this new subsection.

### 1.2 Previous Versions

This is version 1.0.0. Version 0.9.0 didn’t use the Geometry package, which meant that the margins were huge compared to the current 2cm margins.

### 1.3 Future Updates

Things to add in future versions:

1. Use the Geometry package. [DONE]
2. Include an enumerate environment. [DONE]
3. Make the article ‘twocolumn’ using an optional argument [twocolumn] between \documentclass and the ‘article’ between brackets. (Does this really make it look more professional?)
4. Add a picture. (Of what?)
5. Change the font to Comic Sans. (Might be too hard?)

### 3 Exercise 3

Reconstruct the following formulas in the document of the previous Exercise.

$$\int_{-\infty}^{\infty} e^{-ax^2} = \sqrt{\frac{\pi}{a}}$$
$$R_{\mu\nu} - \frac{1}{2}Rg_{\mu\nu} + \Lambda g_{\mu\nu} = \kappa T_{\mu\nu}$$

(This formula uses the Lambda and the mu, nu and kappa from Greek.)
